6. 6. What do we call a piece of card or plastic with a shape cut out of it, which allows you to create a specific pattern when you paint or sponge over it? (1 mark)

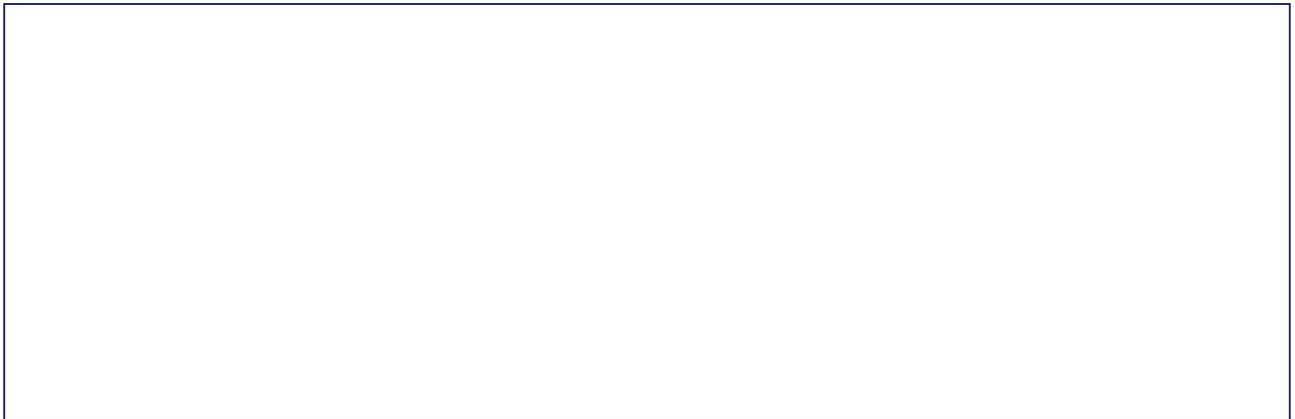
7. 7. The surface you carve or create your design on for printing is often called a _____. (1 mark)
