- A strong password should be at least 8 characters long and include a mix of uppercase letters, lowercase letters, numbers, and symbols.
- Never share your personal information, such as your home address, school name, or telephone number, with people you do not know online.
- Phishing is when someone tries to trick you into revealing private details by pretending to be someone you trust or a company you know.
- If you see something online that makes you feel worried, sad, or confused, always tell a trusted adult immediately.
- Privacy settings are like the locks on your house; they help you control who can see the things you mail and share on the internet.
- Being a good digital citizen means being kind and respectful to others, just as you would be in the classroom or on the playground.
