Learning objective: To identify and use adverbs to describe how actions are performed.

Read the story about Max the monkey and answer the questions below. Remember to look for words that describe how the actions are happening.

Max the monkey stood behind his stall at the jungle market. He was selling colorful fruit and counting his coins very carefully. A customer approached the stall slowly, looking at the shiny apples. Max smiled warmly and greeted the customer with a friendly wave. He picked up a bunch of bananas and placed them neatly into a woven basket. 'That will be £2.50, please,' Max said politely. 5. Do you think Max enjoys running his market stall? Explain why using evidence from the text. (3 marks)
