6. 6. Write the contraction for 'cannot' using an apostrophe. (1 mark)

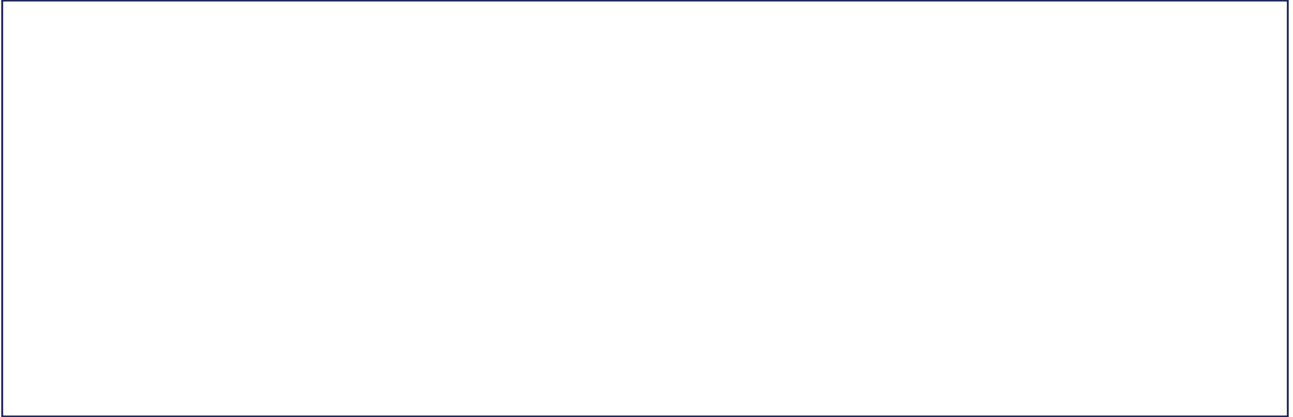
7. 7. If a paintbrush belongs to Zara, how do you write it? (Zara + paintbrush) (1 mark)
