

# Biographical Writing: A Life Story

*Learning objective: To structure a biographical report using appropriate chronological order, subheadings, and formal language.*

Use the prompts below to help you structure a biography about an inspiring person. Remember to use the third person (he/she/they) and focus on significant events that shaped their life.

Born in a quiet village in the heart of England, [Name] was destined to become one of the most remarkable figures of the century.

**1. Introduction: Who is this person and why are they famous? Start by stating their name, birth date, and their primary claim to fame. (2 marks)**

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**2. Early Life: Describe their childhood and education. What interests or challenges did they have as a youngster? (2 marks)**

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**3. Career and Achievements: Explain the major work or discoveries they made. What obstacles did they overcome to succeed? (3 marks)**

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**4. Personal Life and Character: What were they like as a person? Describe their personality traits or hobbies outside of their professional life. (2 marks)**

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**5. Conclusion and Legacy: Justify why this person is remembered today. How has their work impacted the world we live in? (3 marks)**

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**6. Critical Thinking: Compare and contrast their early life with their adult achievements. Do you think their childhood experiences influenced their later success? Explain why. (4 marks)**

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*Extension challenge: Imagine you are interviewing your chosen subject. Write three challenging questions you would ask them to uncover a 'hidden story' from their life that isn't in history books. Justify why these questions would reveal more about their character than standard biographical facts.*
