

Nova's Bonfire Night Quiz

Learning objective: To improve reading comprehension and recall skills based on a non-fiction text about Bonfire Night.

Read the short text below, then use it to answer the 10 questions. Remember to look for clues in the sentences!

Bonfire Night is a special celebration held on the 5th of November in the UK. Many years ago, a man named Guy Fawkes tried to hide gunpowder under the Houses of Parliament. The plan did not work, and people lit bonfires to celebrate that the King was safe. Today, families gather around large bonfires to stay warm. They often eat toffee apples and watch colorful fireworks light up the night sky. Some children hold a handheld sparkler while wearing thick gloves to keep their hands safe. It is a long-standing British tradition.
