

Pip's Book Review Flashcards

Learning objective: To understand the key parts of a book review and share personal opinions about stories.

Read the front of the card to learn about writing a book review. Use the back to test your knowledge with Pip the caterpillar!

What is the 'Title'?

The name of the book.

Who is the 'Author'?

The person who wrote the story.

What is the 'Plot'?

What happens in the story from beginning to end.

What is a 'Character'?

A person, animal, or creature in the story.

What is an 'Opinion'?

Telling someone what you thought about the book.

What is a 'Recommendation'?

Telling someone else if they should read the book.

Why do we use a 'Star Rating'?

To show how much we liked the book (e.g., 5 stars for excellent).

What is a 'Favorite Part'?

The part of the story you liked the most.

If a book costs £5, is that information for a review?

No, a review is about the story, not the price.

True or False: A book review should share how the story made you feel.

True! It is good to say if it made you laugh or feel excited.

Name one thing you might include in your review.

The title, the author, or your opinion.

Who is our friend that loves collecting words for book reviews?

Pip the caterpillar.
