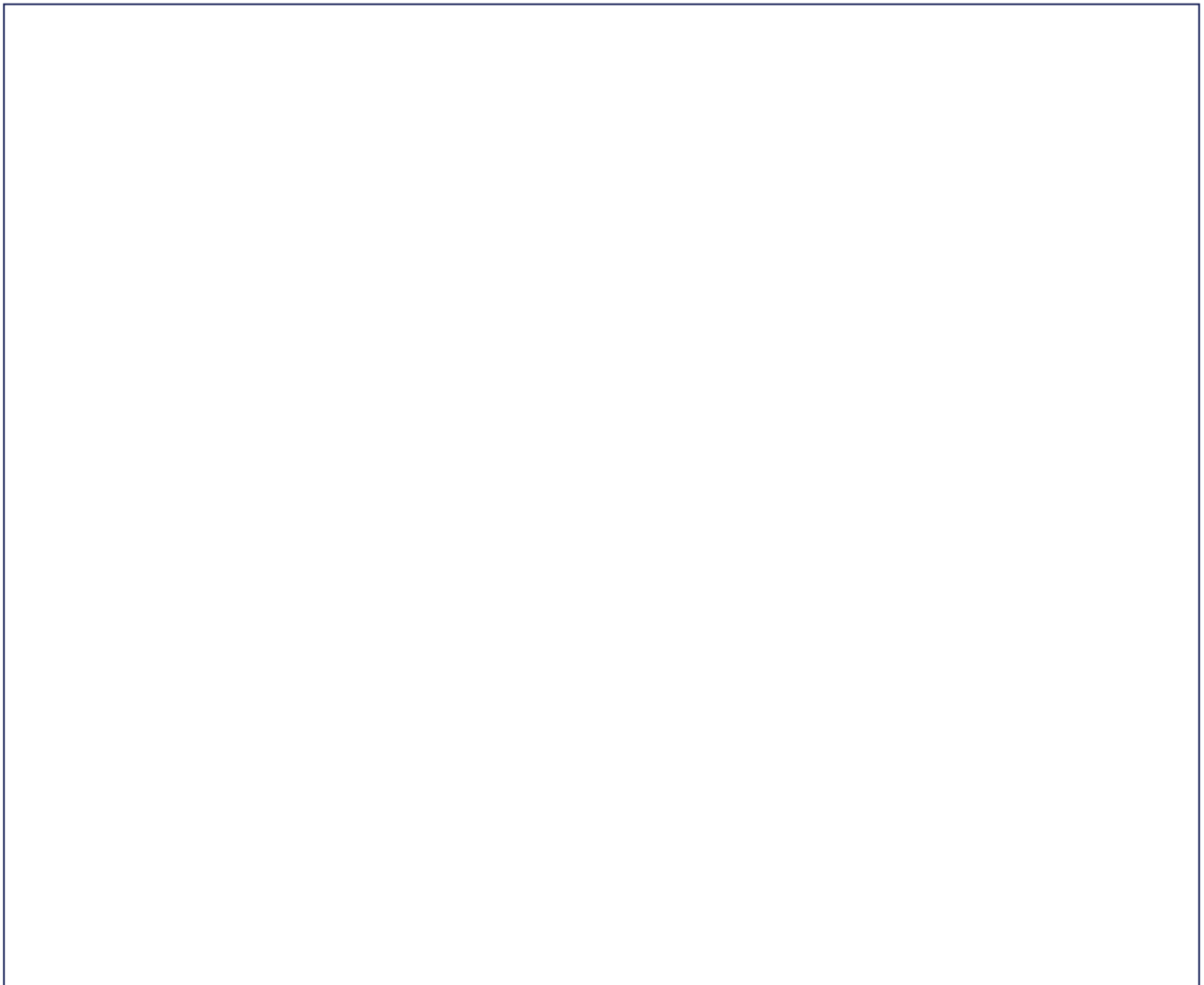


Pip's Favorite Story Drawing Sheet

Learning objective: To express preferences and communicate meaning through drawing and labelling, relating to a story read in class.

Hello! Pip the Bookworm has just finished reading a wonderful story. Now it is your turn! Think about the story you read today and use the space below to show us your favorite part.

Draw: Provide a large, blank rectangular frame on the page with a light dotted border. Encourage the child to draw a scene from their chosen book, focusing on one main character and their surroundings. The style should be open and creative, allowing the child to use pencils, crayons, or felt-tips to show details like weather, buildings, or magical objects.



Label words: character · setting · happy · funny · exciting · favorite

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw your favorite character from the story in the middle of the box.
2. Step 2: Draw the place where the story happens (the setting) behind your character.
3. Step 3: Can you label one thing in your picture using a word from the word bank?
4. Step 4: Use a color to show how the character feels (e.g., yellow for happy).
5. Step 5: Tell your partner one reason why this is your favorite part of the story.
