

Max's Math-Puzzle Adventure: Mastering Fronted Adverbials

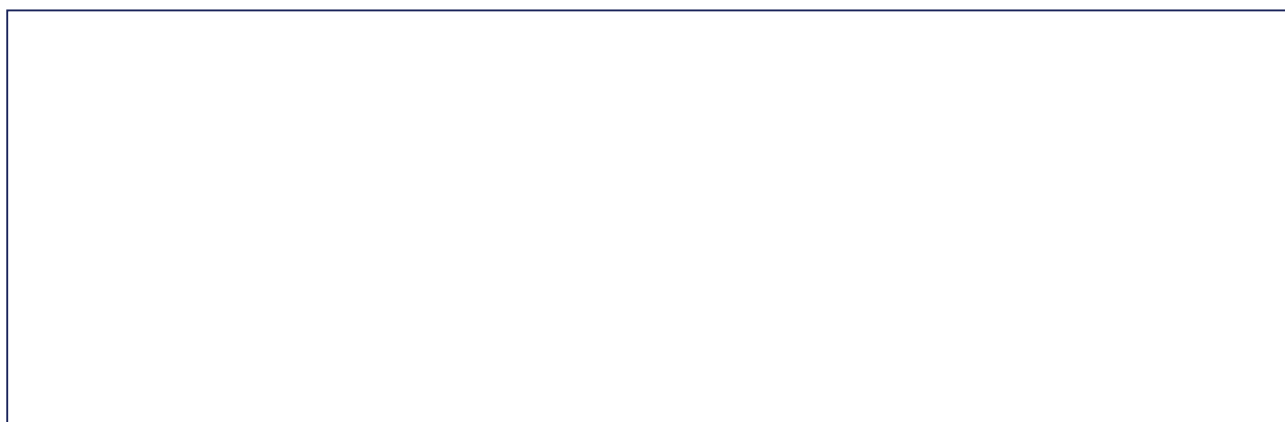
Learning objective: To use fronted adverbials to add detail and interest to sentences about Max the monkey's adventures.
