Learning objective: To identify and use a range of grammatical features, including relative clauses and modal verbs, within a descriptive text.

Read the text carefully, focusing on how the author uses descriptive language and complex sentence structures. Answer the questions in full sentences.

1. How much does a bunch of bananas cost, and what is the price of the larger mangoes? (2 marks)

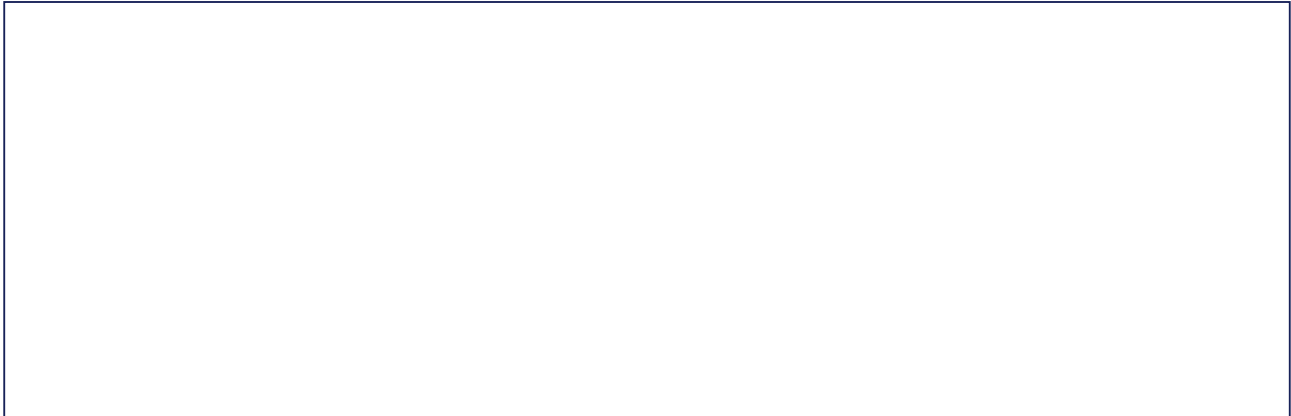
2. Which two characters are mentioned in the passage, and what is each of them interested in? (2 marks)

3. Why does Max feel it is important to organize his fruit stall with such precision? (2 marks)

4. Explain what the author means when they write that Zara saw math as an 'art form'. (2 marks)

5. Do you agree that Max's market is a good way to help his community? Justify your answer using evidence from the text. (3 marks)

Extension challenge: 1. Identify the relative clause in the first sentence. 2. Rewrite the second sentence to include a fronted adverbial. 3. What might happen if Max decided to change his pricing structure to include discounts for bulk buying? 6. Write a short paragraph describing a new item Max might sell, using at least two expanded noun phrases.
