{Time Order Words: {First: 'The step that happens at the very start.', Next: 'The step that follows the one you just did.', Then: 'A word to show what comes after that.', After that: 'Used to describe a later part of the process.', Finally: 'The very last step to finish the job.'}, Action Words (Imperative Verbs): {Cut: 'To use scissors to divide something into pieces.', Fold: 'To bend paper or fabric over itself.', Stick: 'To use glue or tape to join two things together.', Draw: 'To use a pencil or pen to create a picture.', Mix: 'To stir different ingredients together.', Place: 'To put something carefully in a specific spot.'}, Useful Features: {Title: 'The name of your instruction guide.', Equipment: 'A list of everything you need to finish the task.', Method: 'The numbered steps showing how to do the task.', Diagram: 'A labelled drawing that helps show how to do it.'}}
