Learning objective: To organize information into a non-chronological report using subheadings and technical vocabulary.

Today, we are going to act like scientists and explorers! Choose a subject—it could be an animal, a planet, or a historical invention. Fill in each section below to create your own non-chronological report. Remember to use formal language, include interesting facts, and check your punctuation.

1. Introduction: Write a catchy title and a short paragraph to introduce your subject. Tell the reader what the subject is and why it is special. (2 marks)

2. Physical Appearance: Describe what your subject looks like. Mention size, color, and any unique body parts using adjectives. (2 marks)

3. Habitat and Diet: Explain where your subject lives and what it eats. Is it a herbivore, carnivore, or omnivore? (2 marks)

4. Fascinating Facts: List three surprising or 'did you know' facts about your subject to impress your reader. (2 marks)

5. Summary/Conclusion: Write a final sentence to sum up why this subject is important to the natural world. (1 mark)
