Learning objective: To identify persuasive features and understand how authors use language to influence a reader's opinion.

Read the text carefully and answer the questions below. Use evidence from the text to support your points.

1. Identify two specific problems with the park mentioned in the passage. (2 marks)

2. How much money does the writer suggest is needed to improve the park? (1 mark)

3. Why does the writer use the phrase 'choking the flowerbeds' instead of just saying there are weeds? (2 marks)

4. What does the writer believe about the importance of a park to a community? (2 marks)

5. Do you think the writer's argument is effective? Give one reason for your opinion using evidence from the text. (3 marks)

Draw: Draw a 'Before and After' picture of the park. On one side, show the neglected park described in the first paragraph, and on the other, show the 'thriving paradise' the writer hopes to create.



Extension challenge: Write a short paragraph (3-4 sentences) from the perspective of a Town Council member responding to this letter. Will you agree to the funding or suggest an alternative?
