Learning objective: To demonstrate the ability to construct, punctuate, and extend simple sentences using capital letters, full stops, and conjunctions.

Read each question carefully. Remember to use a capital letter at the start of your sentence and a full stop at the end. Use your best handwriting.

Pip the caterpillar is hungry. He finds a leaf. Nova the owl watches from the tree. She likes to look at the stars at night.

1. Find a sentence in the passage above that has a capital letter and a full stop. Copy it out carefully. (2 marks)

2. Look at these words: 'Max / the / monkey / bananas / eats'. Rearrange them to make a sentence that makes sense. (2 marks)

3. Add a full stop and a capital letter to this sentence: 'the sun is very hot' (2 marks)

4. Join these two sentences together using the word 'and': 'Pip eats a leaf. Pip eats a red apple.' (3 marks)

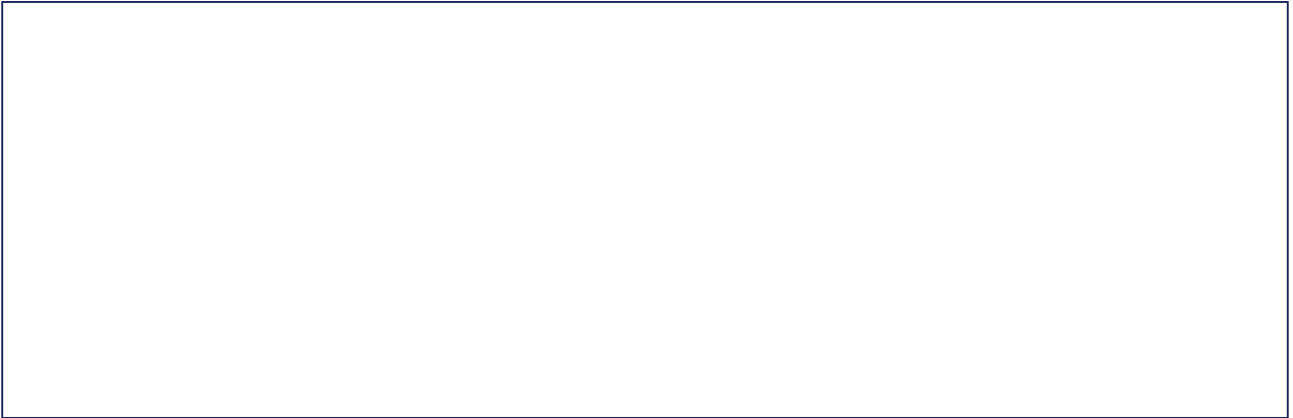
5. Write a sentence to describe what Nova the owl is doing. Remember to start with a capital letter and end with a full stop. (3 marks)

6. Fix this sentence: 'zara the zebra paints a picture'. (Hint: Think about names and the start of sentences.) (3 marks)

7. Extended Writing: Write three sentences about a day out with your friends Pip and Max. Tell us what you did and how you felt. (5 marks)

8. Bonus Challenge: Add the word 'because' to this sentence to make it longer: 'I like reading.' (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Pip the caterpillar having a picnic with Max the monkey. Label one item in your picture.
