

Mastering Speech Marks with Max the Monkey

Learning objective: To use inverted commas (speech marks) accurately to punctuate direct speech in Grade 3 writing.

Max the Monkey is busy solving math puzzles in the jungle, but he needs your help to punctuate what his friends are saying! Read the questions carefully and remember to place your punctuation correctly.

Answer Key: 1. B, 2. True, 3. False, 4. A, 5. 'I love bananas!' said Max., 6. True, 7. B, 8. 'Where are we going?' asked Pip., 9. False, 10. A. Remember: Speech marks go around the words spoken, and a new speaker needs a new line!

6. 6. True or False: If a new person starts speaking, you should start a new line. (1 mark)

7. 7. Which sentence is punctuated correctly? A) 'Hello, said Nova.' B) 'Hello,' said Nova.* C) Hello, 'said Nova.' D) 'Hello' said Nova (1 mark)

8. 8. Add speech marks to this sentence: Where are we going? asked Pip. (1 mark)

9. 9. True or False: You only need speech marks if the person is shouting. (1 mark)

10. 10. In the sentence: 'Look at the stars!' whispered Nova. What is the reporting clause?
A) whispered Nova* B) Look at the stars C) the stars D) speech marks (1 mark)
