

# Pip's Word Collection Adventure

*Learning objective: To improve spelling accuracy and develop reading comprehension skills.*

Read the text carefully and answer the questions below using full sentences.

Pip the caterpillar is not like most insects; he has a magnificent obsession with words. Every morning, Pip crawls through the garden carrying a tiny magnifying glass and a miniature notebook. He searches under dew-covered leaves and behind colorful petals to find new words to add to his collection. Some days, he finds tricky words like 'favorite' or 'knowledge'. Other days, he finds simple, happy words like 'sunshine' or 'breeze'. Pip stores these words in his secret tree-hollow library. He is very careful to spell them correctly, often checking his tiny dictionary to make sure he hasn't missed a single letter. He knows that spelling is like building a house; if you put the bricks in the wrong place, the house might wobble! Pip loves to arrange his words in alphabetical order so he can find them quickly when he writes his letters to his friends. Whether he is spelling a long word or a short one, Pip believes that every letter has a special job to do. Accuracy is the secret ingredient that makes his writing shine bright.
