

Storytelling Secrets with Pip the Bookworm

Learning objective: To understand and identify key features of a story, including characters, settings, and structure.

What is a Character?

A person, animal, or creature that plays a part in a story.

What is a Setting?

The place and time where the story happens.

What do we call the list of events that happen in a story?

The Plot.

What usually happens at the beginning of a story?

We are introduced to the characters and the setting.

What is the 'Problem' in a story?

A challenge or difficulty that the characters must try to fix.

What is the 'Solution'?

The way the problem is solved at the end of the story.

Who is an Author?

The person who writes the story.

What is a Title?

The name of the story, usually found on the front cover.

What happens in the middle of a story?

This is where the action happens and the main problem usually occurs.

How do most stories finish?

With an ending that tells us what happens to the characters after the problem is solved.

What is a 'Fiction' book?

A story that is made up from the author's imagination.

What is 'Non-Fiction'?

A book that gives us true facts and information about the real world.
