*Learning objective: To develop reading comprehension skills by retrieving information, making inferences, and expressing personal opinions about a narrative text.*

Read the story carefully and answer the questions below. Remember to look back at the text to find your answers.

Pip the caterpillar lives in a very special library inside an old oak tree. Pip loves to read! Every morning, Pip crawls along the wooden shelves, looking for a new story to explore. The library is filled with books about brave explorers, talking animals, and far-away lands. Sometimes, Pip finds a book about a forest full of shiny, silver leaves. Other times, Pip reads about a deep blue ocean where fish play tag. Pip's favorite thing is to collect new words. When Pip finds a big, exciting word, they write it on a tiny scrap of paper and keep it in a jar. Pip believes that every book is a doorway to a new adventure. One sunny afternoon, Pip opened a book and started to dream. Pip imagined flying high above the clouds on the back of a giant, friendly kite. When Pip finished reading, they smiled and put the book back on the shelf. Pip was already excited to pick the next story tomorrow.
