- An anagram is a word made by rearranging the letters of another word. For example, 'listen' is an anagram of 'silent'.
- Synonyms are words that have the same or very similar meanings, like 'huge' and 'enormous'.
- Antonyms are words with opposite meanings. If you know that 'hot' is the antonym of 'cold', you are already thinking like a linguist!
- An analogy shows a relationship between two things. 'Puppy is to dog as kitten is to cat' is a perfect example of comparing categories.
- A prefix is a letter or group of letters added to the start of a word to change its meaning, such as 'un-' in 'unhappy'.
- A suffix is added to the end of a word to create a new word, like adding '-ly' to 'quick' to make 'quickly'.

Did you know? Did you know? Verbal reasoning isn't just about reading; it is like a workout for your brain! By spotting how words connect to each other, you are training your mind to solve complex puzzles, just like Max the monkey does when he counts his bananas.
