

Rosa's Body Part Fact-File: Mon Corps

Learning objective: To identify, spell, and use French vocabulary for parts of the human body accurately within a written context.

Help Rosa the parrot learn about human anatomy! Use the word bank provided to label your own body diagram and complete the fact-file sections below. Make sure to use the correct articles (le, la, or les) when writing your answers.

Word bank: la tête · le bras · la main · la jambe · le pied · les yeux · le nez · la bouche

1. My Head and Face: Describe your head and face using French vocabulary. Mention how many of each feature you have (e.g., J'ai deux yeux). (3 marks)

2. My Limbs: List the parts of your arms and legs. Explain why it is important to take care of these parts when playing sports. (4 marks)

3. Compare and Contrast: Compare the French words for body parts to English words. Are there any patterns in the spelling or sounds you notice? Justify your observations. (4 marks)

4. Creative Application: If you were drawing a mythical creature, which French body parts would you give it? Describe your creature using full French sentences. (5 marks)

5. Reflective Thinking: Explain why French uses different articles like 'le', 'la', and 'les'. Why might it be important to learn the correct gender for each noun? (4 marks)

6. Hypothetical Scenario: What might happen if humans had different body parts, such as wings instead of arms? Use French vocabulary to describe how this would change your daily routine. (4 marks)

Extension challenge: Challenge: Research three additional French body parts not found in the word bank (e.g., le dos, le ventre, le doigt). Write a short paragraph in French explaining the function of these parts, using a dictionary or your classroom resources to help with verb conjugation.
