*Learning objective: To identify and recall French vocabulary for common items of clothing and develop understanding of gendered nouns.*

Join Rosa the parrot on a fashion adventure! Read the questions carefully and test your French vocabulary skills. Remember to look for the little clues about whether a word is masculine or feminine.

9. 9. True or False: 'Des' is used when talking about plural items, like socks. (1 mark)

If Rosa bought a sweater for £12 and a hat for £5, how would you write the total price in a French sentence? 5. What might happen if you used the wrong article (un/une) when speaking to a French speaker? 6. Research and describe the difference between 'le/la/les' and 'un/une' in French grammar.*
