

Rosa's French Number Assessment: Grade 4

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of French numbers from 0 to 50 and apply them to simple calculations and real-world scenarios.

Read each question carefully. Rosa the parrot has provided a word bank to help you. Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot is helping her friends at the BookFlik market. She is counting the items for sale to make sure everything is ready for the day. Use your knowledge of French numbers to help her complete the stock list.

Word bank: zéro · cinq · dix · douze · quinze · vingt · vingt-et-un · trente · quarante · cinquante · plus · moins · égal

1. Write the French words for the following numbers: a) 10, b) 15, c) 30. (3 marks)

2. Translate these number sentences into French: a) $5 + 5 = 10$, b) $40 - 20 = 20$. (4 marks)

3. Max has 21 apples. He gives 6 apples to Pip. How many apples does Max have left? Write the answer in French as a full sentence (e.g., 'Max a...'). (4 marks)

4. Explain why it is important to know the spelling of numbers like 'vingt-et-un' compared to 'vingt'. (4 marks)

5. Rosa is counting boxes of books. She has 5 stacks of 9 books. Calculate the total number of books and write the number in French words. (5 marks)

6. If a notebook costs £12, how much would 4 notebooks cost in total? Write the final amount in French words. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a market stall with exactly 15 apples and 12 oranges, and label the quantities in French.
