

Rosa's French Number Garden: Les Nombres

Jump into the garden with Rosa the parrot and learn to count in French!

- **Un, deux, trois:** The sequence of numbers in French follows the same order as in English.
- Numbers 1 to 16 have unique names, but 17, 18, and 19 use the prefix 'dix-' to show they are in the teens.
- The number 20 is written as 'vingt' and marks the end of our garden counting path.
- When writing numbers in French, remember that they do not use capital letters unless they are at the start of a sentence.
- Rosa reminds us that 'seize' is the French word for 16, which is a great one to practice aloud!

Did you know? Did you know? In French, numbers from 17 to 19 are made by combining the word for 10 (dix) with the number. For example, 17 is 'dix-sept', which literally translates as 'ten-seven'!
