

Rosa's School Day Assessment: L'école

Learning objective: To assess vocabulary, sentence structure, and comprehension regarding school subjects, classroom items, and opinions in French.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you construct your sentences. Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot is flying over the classroom. She sees pupils using their pens, rubbers, and exercise books. She listens to them talking about their favorite subjects. Some children think math is easy, but others think it is difficult.

Word bank: les math (math) · l'anglais (English) · l'art (art) · le sport (PE) · j'aime (I like) · je n'aime pas (I do not like) · le crayon (pencil) · la gomme (eraser) · le cahier (exercise book) · le stylo (pen) · facile (easy) · difficile (difficult)

1. Translate the following classroom items into French: 1) The pencil, 2) The eraser. (2 marks)

2. Write a sentence in French expressing your opinion about a school subject (e.g., 'I like PE'). (2 marks)

3. Translate the following sentence into English: 'J'aime les math parce que c'est facile.' (2 marks)

4. If a friend tells you 'Je n'aime pas l'art', explain in English what they are saying and why they might have said it. (4 marks)

5. Compare and contrast 'le sport' and 'les math'. Use French sentences to describe if you find them 'facile' or 'difficile' and explain why. (4 marks)

6. Justify your answer: Why is it important to have a variety of subjects like Art and PE in a school curriculum? Answer in English. (6 marks)

7. Extended Writing: Write a short paragraph (5-6 sentences) in French describing your perfect school day. Include your favorite subject, what equipment you use, and one reason why you enjoy being at school. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw your school desk with at least three items on it. Label each item in French (e.g., le stylo, le cahier, la gomme).



Extension challenge: Imagine you are an exchange student in a French school. What might happen if you forgot your 'cahier'? Write a creative dialogue between you and your teacher in French, using at least three polite phrases. Total: /25
