

Rosa's French Market Adventure

Learning objective: To identify and use French vocabulary for common shopping items and express prices in dollars and cents.

Help Rosa the parrot set up her bustling market stall! Use the vocabulary in the word bank to label your drawing and practice your French shopping phrases.

Draw: Draw a vibrant, colorful market scene. In the center, draw a wooden stall with a striped canopy. Include Rosa the parrot standing behind the counter. On the counter, draw the items from the word bank (an apple, a croissant, a loaf of bread, a wedge of cheese, and a carrot). Add small price tags hanging from each item. Keep the style bright, cheerful, and clear, like a sketchbook illustration.



Label words: une pomme (an apple) · un croissant (a croissant) · du pain (some bread) · du fromage (some cheese) · une carotte (a carrot) · C'est combien ? (How much is it?) · Ça coûte £1.50 (It costs £1.50)

Steps:

1. Draw a market stall with at least four items from the word bank. Label each item in French.
2. Write a price tag in dollars and cents next to each of your four items (e.g., £1.20).
3. Explain why it is important to know the correct currency format when shopping in a French market.
4. Compare and contrast buying food at an outdoor market stall versus a large supermarket. Justify your

answer.

5. Rosa wants to buy three croissants costing £0.80 each. Calculate the total cost. Show your working.
6. What might happen if a shopkeeper misunderstood your request? How could you use non-verbal communication to help?
