

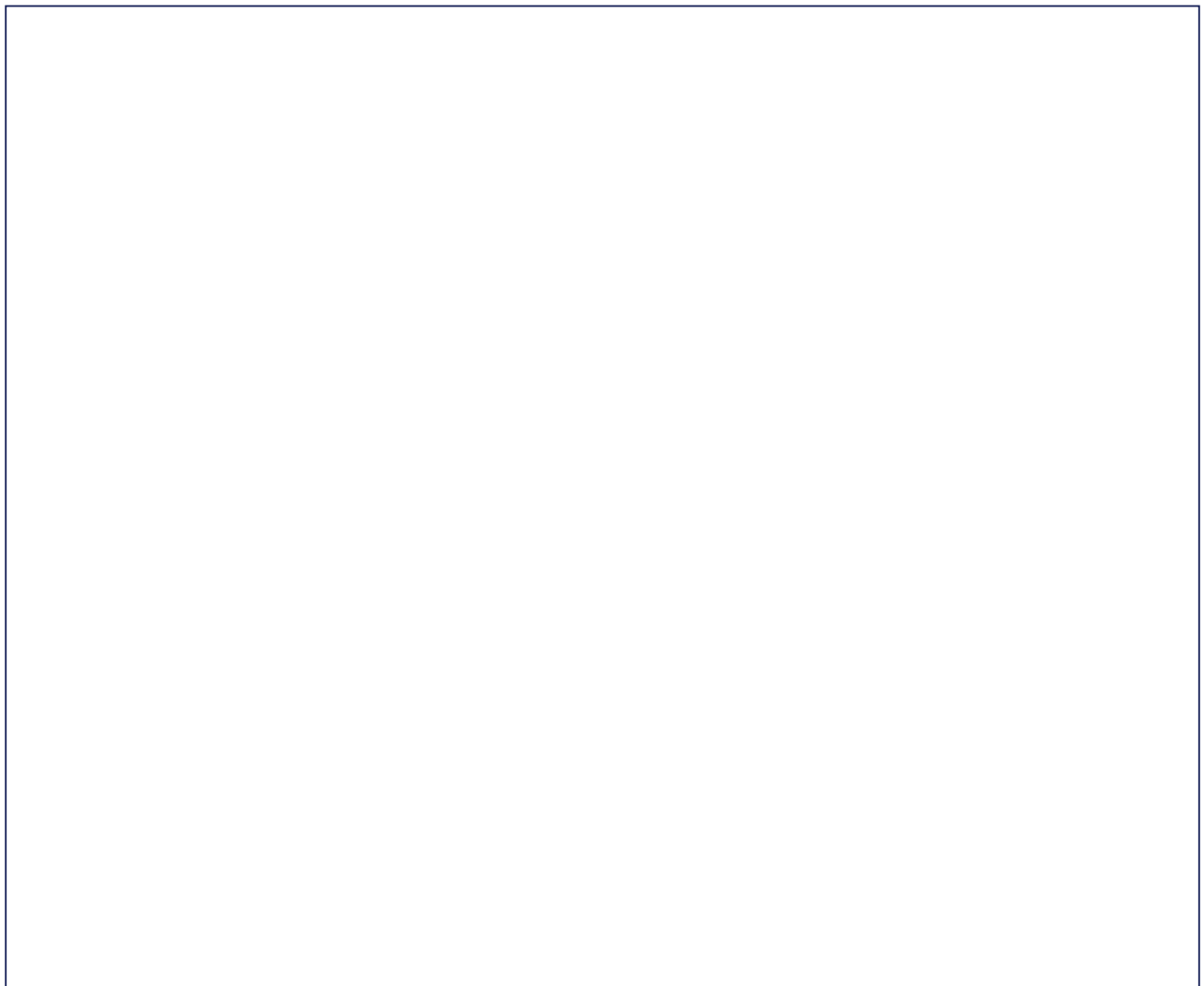
Rosa's French Timekeeping Challenge

Learning objective: To tell and write the time in French using o'clock, half past, and quarter past/to.

Rosa the parrot is busy planning her day! Use the word bank to label the clocks and complete the drawing activity. Remember: in French, we use 'et quart' for quarter past, 'et demie' for half past, and 'moins le quart' for quarter to.

Draw: Draw four large, circular clock faces arranged in a square on your page. In the center of the page, draw Rosa the parrot wearing a colorful scarf, holding a pointer stick.

Underneath each clock, leave a blank line for the French label. Use a clean, educational style with clear lines so the hands of the clocks are easy to read and draw.



Label words: Il est une heure · Il est deux heures et quart · Il est trois heures et demie · Il est quatre heures moins le quart · midi · minuit

Steps:

1. Label the first clock on your drawing to show 'Il est une heure'.
2. Label the second clock to show 'Il est deux heures et quart'.
3. Draw the hands on the third clock to show 'Il est trois heures et demie'.
4. Draw the hands on the fourth clock to show 'Il est quatre heures moins le quart'.
5. If Rosa eats lunch at 12:00 (midi) and snacks at 12:30 (midi et demie), write the French phrase for the

snack time.
