

En Route ! Transport in French

Pack your bags and get ready to travel! Learn how to say how you get around in French with Rosa the parrot.

- To say you travel by train, you use the phrase 'en train'.
- If you are cycling to school, you say 'Je vais à l'école en vélo'.
- When you walk, you must use the special phrase 'à pied'.
- You can describe a vehicle as 'rapide' if it moves very quickly.
- Rosa says that 'Le voyage est long' means the journey is long.

Did you know? Did you know? In French, we use the word 'en' for most modes of transport, except when we walk! We say 'à pied' because we are using our feet, not a vehicle.
