

En Voyage ! Transport in French

Hop on board and explore the world of French travel with Rosa the Parrot!

- To say you are traveling by a specific mode of transport, use the word 'en'. For example, 'en train' means 'by train'.
- When talking about a bicycle, we use 'à vélo' instead of 'en vélo'.
- If you are walking, the French phrase is 'à pied'. It literally means 'on foot'.
- Remember that 'la' is used for feminine nouns like 'la voiture', while 'le' is used for masculine nouns like 'le bus'.
- If a word starts with a vowel, like 'avion', we use 'l'' instead of 'le' or 'la'. So it is 'l'avion'.

Did you know? Did you know? The Paris Métro is one of the oldest and busiest underground systems in the world! It first opened in 1900 and features beautiful Art Nouveau entrances designed by Hector Guimard.
