Learning objective: To identify and describe the key geographical features, climate zones, and countries within the continent of Africa.

1. Location and Borders: Describe where Africa is located on the globe. Which oceans border the continent to the east and the west? (2 marks)

2. Climate Zones: Africa has many different climates. Choose two different environments (e.g., desert, rainforest, or savannah) and describe what the weather is like there. (3 marks)

3. Physical Features: Name one major river and one major mountain range found in Africa. Why are these important to the local landscape? (3 marks)

4. Human Geography: Choose one African country. Write down its capital city and one interesting fact about its culture or population. (2 marks)

5. The Equator: Explain what the Equator is and why it passes through the middle of the African continent. (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Imagine you are an explorer traveling across the continent. Write a short paragraph describing one animal you might see and how it has adapted to live in its specific African habitat.
