■ The Equator is an imaginary line that circles the Earth halfway between the North and South Poles, dividing the planet into the Northern and Southern Hemispheres.

■ Antarctica is the only continent that has no permanent human residents, though many brave scientists live there temporarily to study our climate.

■ Continents are vast landmasses, while oceans are the expansive bodies of saltwater that fill the basins between these lands.

Did you know? Did you know? Even though we call them separate oceans, they are all actually one giant, interconnected body of salt water that covers about 71% of the Earth's surface! Finn loves to swim between them, exploring the hidden currents that link our world together.
