Learning objective: To identify and describe the locations of the world's seven continents and five oceans.

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions below using full sentences. Pay close attention to the details provided by Finn the dolphin.

The Pacific is the largest and deepest, while the Arctic Ocean remains icy and cold near the North Pole. The equator, an imaginary line circling the middle of the Earth, helps us divide the world into the Northern and Southern Hemispheres. 4. Based on the text, what does the word 'landmasses' refer to when discussing continents? (2 marks)

5. Finn suggests that studying maps helps us protect the environment. Do you agree with this? Give a reason for your opinion. (3 marks)
