

Finn's Weather Explorer Challenge

Learning objective: To identify different types of weather and understand how they change our environment and our clothing choices.

Finn the dolphin is exploring the world and needs to know what the weather is like! Look at the weather types in the word bank. Draw a line to match the weather description to the correct picture or clothing item, then answer the questions to help Finn prepare for his travels.

Word bank: Sunny · Rainy · Windy · Snowy · Cloudy

1. If it is very sunny outside, what should you wear to protect your eyes and skin? (2 marks)

2. When it is raining, what two things might you use to stay dry? (2 marks)

3. Finn sees a snowman. What was the weather like for the snowman to be made? (2 marks)

4. Look out of your classroom window. What is the weather like today? (2 marks)

5. Why do we wear a thick coat when it is cold outside? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of yourself playing outside. Make sure to draw the weather clearly (e.g., a bright sun, raindrops, or fluffy white clouds) and show what clothes you are wearing for that weather.
