

History Assessment: Florence Nightingale

Learning objective: To evaluate knowledge and understanding of the life, work, and legacy of Florence Nightingale during the Crimean War.

Read each question carefully. Answer in full sentences where required. Ensure your handwriting is clear and your spelling is accurate.

Ellie the elephant has been reading about the history of medicine. She discovered that in the 1850s, Florence Nightingale travelled to the Barrack Hospital in Scutari during the Crimean War. At the time, conditions were poor, and many soldiers were dying from infections caused by a lack of cleanliness. Florence used her skills to change how hospitals were run, saving many lives and changing the nursing profession forever.

4. Explain why Florence Nightingale is considered a pioneer for modern nursing. (4 marks) (4 marks)

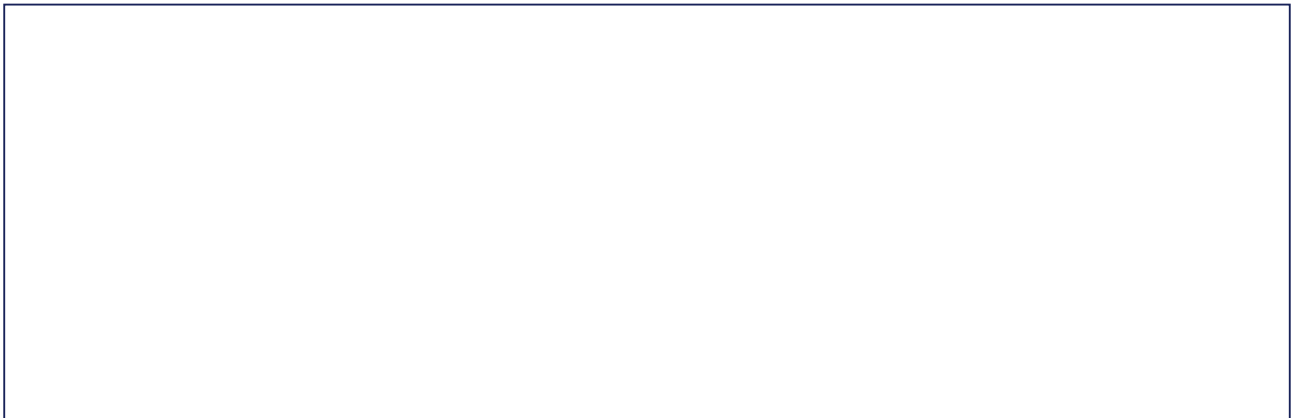
5. How did Florence Nightingale use mathematics and data to prove that her changes were saving lives? (4 marks) (4 marks)
