

History Assessment: The Moon Landing and Neil Armstrong

Learning objective: To evaluate understanding of the Space Race, the Apollo 11 mission, and the historical significance of Neil Armstrong.

Read each question carefully. Use your historical knowledge to provide detailed answers. Ensure you use appropriate historical vocabulary.

In July 1969, the world watched in awe as the Apollo 11 mission reached the Moon. Neil Armstrong, the mission commander, became the first human to step onto the lunar surface. This event was the climax of the 'Space Race', a period of intense competition between the United States and the Soviet Union to achieve superior spaceflight capability. Armstrong's famous words, 'That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind,' reflected the magnitude of this achievement for all of humanity.

7. Justify why it is important for historians to study primary sources, such as photographs and radio transcripts, from the 1969 Moon landing. (5 marks) (5 marks)

8. If the Moon landing had failed, what might have been the impact on the global perception of space exploration? (5 marks) (5 marks)
