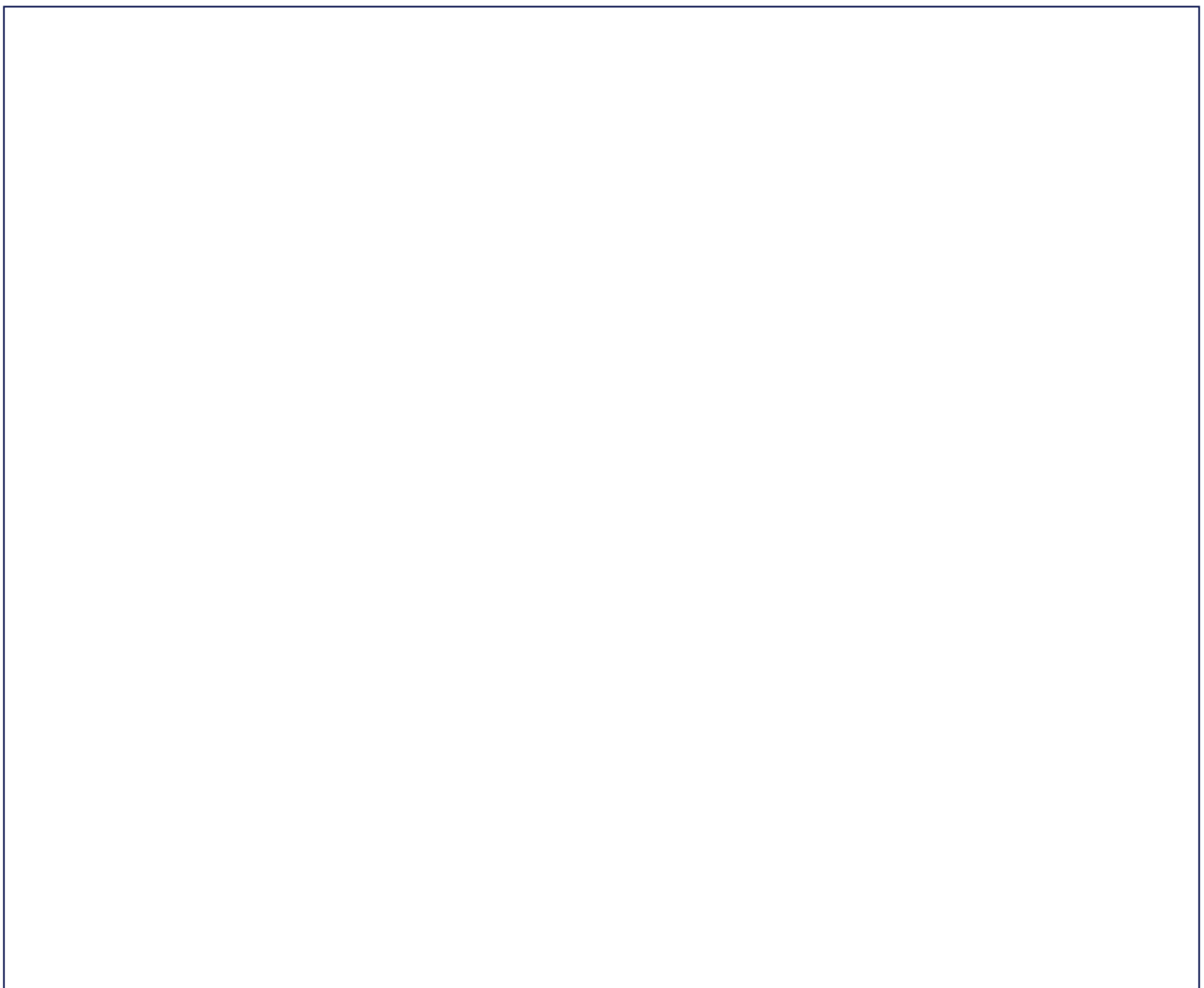


Remembrance Day: A Tribute to Peace

Learning objective: To understand the significance of Remembrance Day and identify key symbols associated with commemoration.

Follow the drawing steps below to create a commemorative scene. Use your artistic skills to add detail, texture, and color. Ensure you incorporate the vocabulary from the word bank into your labels.

Draw: Create a respectful and solemn commemorative scene. In the foreground, draw a large, detailed red poppy with delicate, crinkled petals. In the middle ground, sketch a stone monument or Cenotaph, using straight lines and shading to show texture. Surround the monument with a peaceful landscape, perhaps a soft, cloudy sky. Use a warm, respectful color palette—deep reds for the poppies, greys and creams for the stone, and muted greens for the grass.



Label words: Poppy · Cenotaph · Wreath · Medal · Silence · Remembrance · Tribute · Soldier

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large, vibrant poppy in the center of your page. Label the petals and the stem.
2. Step 2: Draw a simple Cenotaph or monument in the background. Explain why monuments like these are important for local communities.
3. Step 3: Add a wreath of flowers at the base of your monument. Label the wreath.

4. Compare and contrast: Why do we use the poppy as a symbol of remembrance instead of a different flower? Justify your reasoning.
5. What might happen if we chose to forget the history of the world wars? Explain the importance of historical memory.
6. Justify why it is important to hold a two-minute silence on Remembrance Day.
