

## Max's Musical Math: Mastering Rhythm

*Learning objective: To understand and apply musical notation by matching note values to their correct beat counts in a 4/4 time signature.*

Max the monkey loves to treat music like a math puzzle! Look at the 'Word Bank' to see the names of the musical notes and their values. Your task is to solve the rhythm equations below by filling in the blanks. Each bar must add up to 4 beats in total. Use the note values provided: Semibreve = 4 beats, Minim = 2 beats, Crotchet = 1 beat, Quaver = 0.5 beats.

*Word bank: Semibreve (4 beats) · Minim (2 beats) · Crotchet (1 beat) · Quaver (0.5 beats)*

**1. Equation 1: 1 Minim + 1 Crotchet + ? = 4 beats. Which note do you need to complete the bar? (2 marks)**

**2. Equation 2: 1 Crotchet + 1 Crotchet + 1 Crotchet + ? = 4 beats. Which note completes this bar? (2 marks)**
