- **Instruments like the djembe drum, the sitar, and the panpipes each create a unique timbre, which is the specific 'color' or quality of the sound they produce.**
- **Rhythm is the heart of global music; complex time signatures and syncopated beats are common in many traditional styles, encouraging dance and movement.**
- **Music often plays a vital role in celebrations, religious ceremonies, and historical storytelling, helping communities keep their shared history alive through song.**
