- **Choreography** is the art of designing a sequence of movements. By planning your transitions, you ensure your dance flows smoothly from one shape to the next.
- When dancers perform in unison, they all move at exactly the same time, which creates a powerful and balanced visual effect for the audience.
- **Dynamics** refer to the speed, energy, and force of your movements. Using slow, fluid motions followed by sharp, sudden actions creates interest and contrast.
- A **canon** is a choreographic device where dancers perform the same movement one after another, like a ripple traveling across a pond.
- **Spatial awareness** is essential for safety and performance; it means knowing exactly where you are on the stage in relation to other dancers and the space around you.
