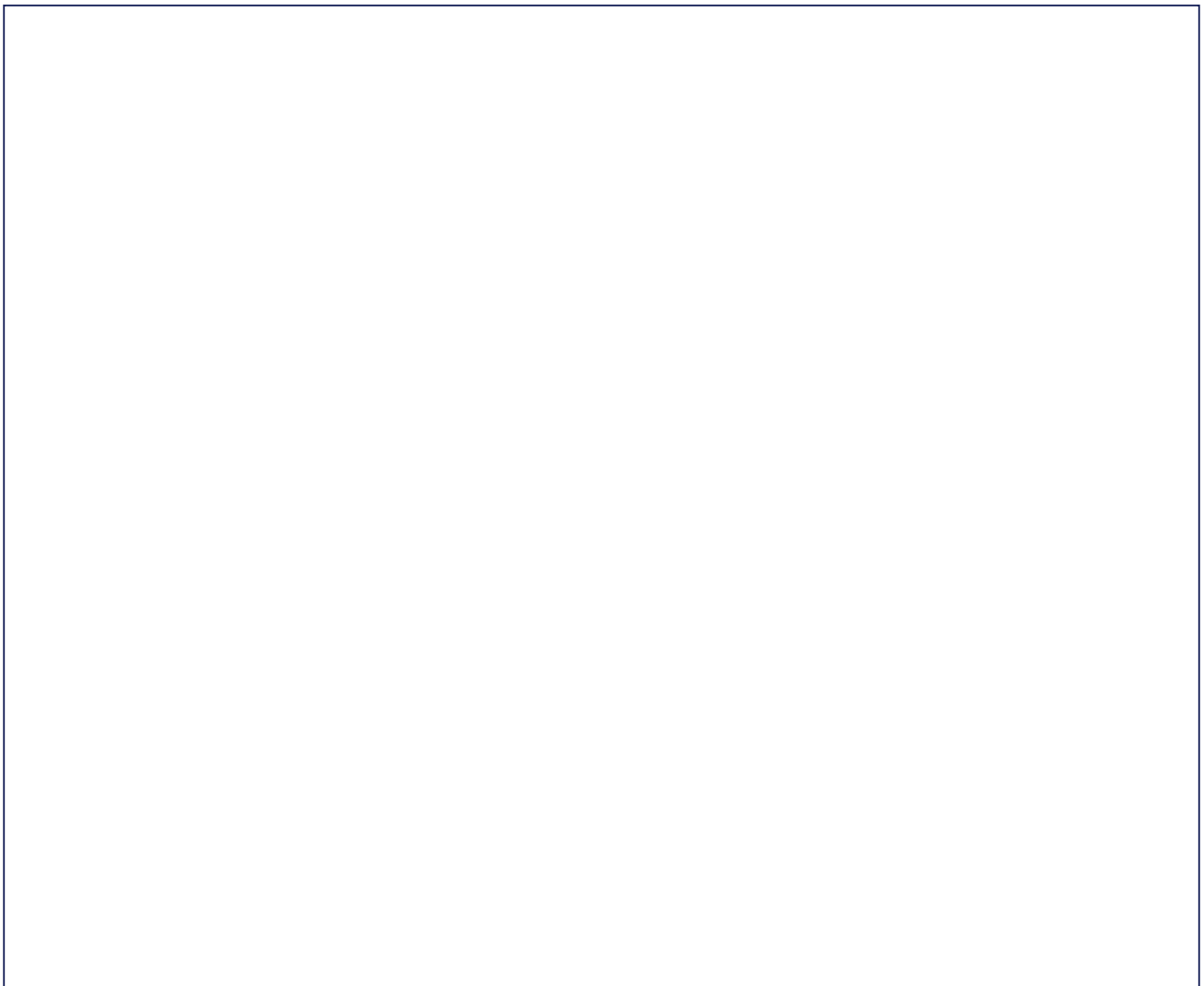


The Pillars of Friendship: A Drawing Activity

Learning objective: To identify and illustrate the positive qualities that build and maintain healthy, supportive friendships.

Use the drawing space provided to create a visual representation of a strong friendship. Think about what makes a person a good friend and include these qualities in your drawing. Use the word bank to help you label your artwork.

Draw: Draw a scene featuring two friends, perhaps inspired by characters like Leo the lion and Kit the fox, sharing an activity like planting a garden or solving a puzzle. The style should be clear and expressive. Ensure the characters are interacting positively. Use the empty space around the characters to label the qualities from the word bank using arrows.



Label words: Trust · Empathy · Kindness · Honesty · Loyalty · Support · Respect · Communication

Steps:

1. Identify one quality from the word bank and explain why it is important for a friendship to last a long time.
2. Step 1: Draw two friends working together on a task. Label three positive traits they are showing in your drawing.
3. Step 2: Add a speech bubble to your drawing. Write a sentence that shows how one friend is being supportive to the other.

4. Step 3: Draw a 'bridge' connecting your two characters. Write one word on the bridge that represents what holds the friendship together.
5. List two ways you can show 'Respect' to a friend if you both have different opinions on a game or activity.
