Learning objective: To understand how to stay safe, be respectful, and protect personal information when using the internet.

Help Kit the fox become a digital expert! Use this fact-file to note down the golden rules for navigating the online world safely. Think about what information is private, how to be kind to others, and what to do if something online makes you feel uncomfortable or worried.

1. My Private Details: List three types of personal information that you should never share with strangers online (e.g., your full name, home address). (3 marks)

2. Password Power: Explain why it is important to use a strong, unique password and why you should never share it with anyone other than your parents or carers. (2 marks)

3. Being Kind Online: Describe how you can be a positive and respectful friend when messaging others or playing games online. (2 marks)

4. The 'Stop and Think' Rule: If you see something online that makes you feel sad, scared, or confused, what are the steps you should take? (3 marks)

5. Digital Footprint: In your own words, explain what a 'digital footprint' is and why it is important to think before you mail or share content. (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Design a 'Digital Safety Poster' featuring Kit the fox. Include one catchy slogan that reminds your classmates to stay safe and be kind while using the internet.
