

Building Stronger Bonds

Learning objective: To understand the importance of positive relationships and how to navigate disagreements with empathy and respect.

Read the passage below carefully, then answer the questions that follow in full sentences.

In the vibrant Meadow School, Pip the caterpillar and Max the monkey were working on a collaborative art project. They were tasked with creating a model of the solar system. However, they soon reached a disagreement; Max wanted to use bright, neon colors for the planets, while Pip believed they should stick to scientific accuracy. 2. What advice did Ellie give to Pip and Max to help them resolve their argument? (1 mark)

3. Why do you think Pip and Max's voices grew louder during their disagreement? (2 marks)

4. How can we tell that Pip and Max value their relationship more than being 'right'? (2 marks)

5. Do you agree that compromise is the best way to solve a disagreement? Explain your reasoning. (3 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Pip and Max working together on their solar system model, showing them looking happy and sharing their ideas.



Extension challenge: Write a short dialogue between two friends who have different ideas for a game, showing how they use 'active listening' to reach a compromise.
