

Bonfire Night with Nova the Owl

Learning objective: To understand the traditions of Bonfire Night and the importance of staying safe around fire and bright lights.

Read the questions carefully with your teacher or grown-up. Look at the word bank to help you spell your answers.

Word bank: firework · sparkler · warm · safe · bright · bonfire

1. Nova the Owl loves the bright colors in the sky on Bonfire Night. What do we call the loud, colorful things that go pop in the sky? (2 marks)

2. When we are outside at night, we need to stay close to our grown-ups to be safe. Why is a bonfire very hot? (2 marks)

3. If you hold a sparkler, you must always wear a glove to protect your hand. How does a sparkler look when you move it in the air? (2 marks)

4. Max the monkey wants to buy a bag of toffee apples for £2. If he has a £1 coin and a £2 coin, does he have enough money? (2 marks)

5. Nova asks: Why do we wear warm coats and hats when we go to watch the bonfire? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Nova the Owl watching the fireworks in the night sky. Make sure to use bright colors for the fireworks!



Extension challenge: Talk to a friend about one rule you must follow to stay safe on Bonfire Night. Can you draw a 'Safety Hero' badge to show you know how to be careful?
