Learning objective: To explore and compare different creation stories and understand their significance to religious communities.

Read the text carefully with Ellie the Elephant, then answer the questions below to test your understanding.

1. According to the passage, what is the main purpose of a creation story? (2 marks)

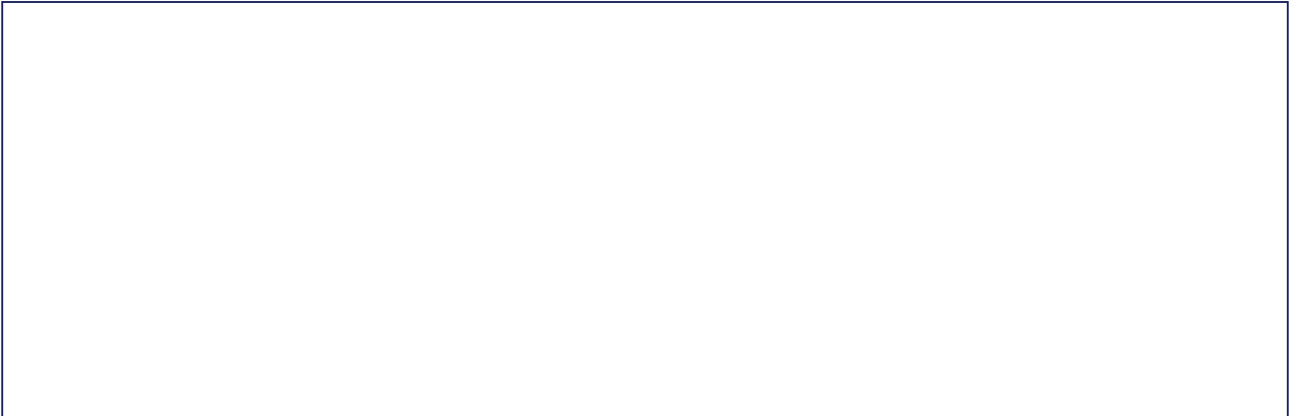
2. What does the text suggest about the relationship between creation stories and how people live their lives? (2 marks)

5. Do you think it is important for people to learn about creation stories from religions other than their own? Justify your answer. (3 marks)
