

Leo's Kind Choices

Learning objective: To understand the difference between kind and unkind actions and reflect on how our choices affect others.

Leo the Lion is learning about how to be a good friend. Look at the list of actions below. Decide if each action is a 'Kind Choice' or an 'Unkind Choice'. Write 'Kind' or 'Unkind' next to each sentence and explain why you think that using our word bank.

Word bank: happy · sad · sharing · helping · hurting · listening

1. Sam sees a friend fall over in the playground. Sam stops to help them stand up. Is this a Kind or Unkind choice? (2 marks)

2. Mia has two stickers. She keeps both for herself and does not let anyone else see them. Is this a Kind or Unkind choice? (2 marks)

3. Ben is talking, but Tom interrupts him loudly. Is this a Kind or Unkind choice? (2 marks)

4. Lily asks if she can play with the blocks. Leo says 'Yes, let's build together!' Is this a Kind or Unkind choice? (2 marks)

5. How do you feel when someone shares their toys with you? (2 marks)
