

Reflecting on Prayer: A Personal Perspective

Learning objective: To articulate an understanding of prayer within different religious traditions and reflect on its significance in the lives of believers.

Use the prompts below to structure your reflection. Think carefully about why people pray, how they do it, and what it means to them. Use the word bank to help connect your ideas.

1. Define the concept of prayer: In your own words, explain what prayer is and why it might be considered important to a person of faith... (2 marks)

2. Compare and contrast: How might a silent, personal prayer differ from a communal prayer shared in a place of worship? Consider the atmosphere and the purpose of each... (3 marks)

3. Explain why: Why do many people choose to express gratitude, ask for forgiveness, or seek guidance during prayer? Justify your reasoning using examples... (3 marks)

4. Evaluate the role of objects: Many religions use items like beads, prayer mats, or candles. Explain why these physical objects can help someone focus during their prayer... (2 marks)

5. What might happen if...: Imagine a world where people did not have a way to reflect or express their hopes through prayer. How might this change the way individuals handle difficult challenges? (3 marks)

6. Personal Synthesis: If you were to write a 'prayer of gratitude', what three things would you include and why? How would this act of reflection influence your daily actions? (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Challenge: Research a specific posture or ritual associated with prayer in a religion you are less familiar with (e.g., kneeling, prostration, or the use of repetitive chants). Write a short paragraph explaining how these physical actions might enhance the spiritual experience of the believer.
