**1. Introduction: Describe the process of ingestion by starting with: The journey of food begins in the mouth, where the teeth and saliva... (2 marks)**

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**2. The Oesophagus and Stomach: Explain how food travels after swallowing by using: Once the food is swallowed, it passes down the oesophagus into the stomach, where... (3 marks)**

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**3. The Small Intestine: Explain the role of nutrients by starting with: After leaving the stomach, the food enters the small intestine, which is where... (3 marks)**

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**4. The Large Intestine: Describe the final stage by starting with: Finally, the remaining waste moves into the large intestine, where the body... (2 marks)**

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**5. Compare and contrast: Explain why the small intestine is considered the most important part of the digestive system compared to the large intestine. Justify your reasoning. (4 marks)**

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**6. Higher-Order Thinking: What might happen to a human's energy levels if their stomach was unable to break down food effectively? Explain your prediction. (4 marks)**
