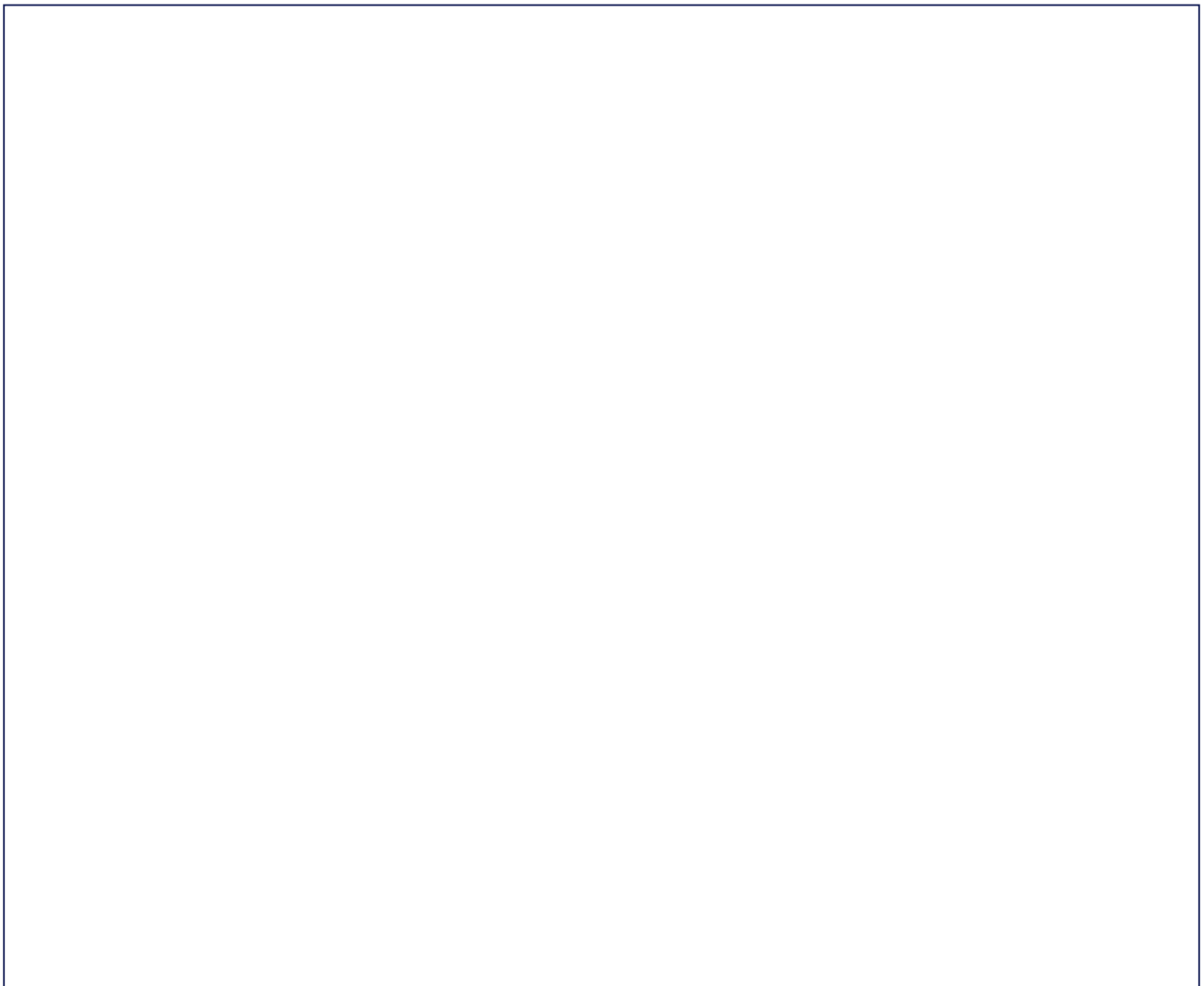


Nova's Habitat Discovery Sheet

Learning objective: To identify and illustrate how animals are adapted to their specific habitats.

Use the space provided to create a detailed drawing of a woodland habitat. Ensure you include the specific features that help organisms thrive in this environment. Use the word bank to label your diagram accurately.

Draw: Create a detailed scene of a deciduous woodland. In the style of a biological field sketch, draw tall trees with broad leaves, a layer of fallen leaves on the forest floor, and at least two animals (such as a squirrel or an owl). Use clear lines and ensure the habitat features are easy to identify for labelling.



Label words: Canopy · Understorey · Deciduous trees · Shelter · Camouflage · Food source · Environment

Steps:

1. Explain one way a woodland animal uses camouflage to survive in the habitat you have drawn.
2. Label your drawing to show where a bird might find shelter from the rain.
3. Identify one producer (a plant) in your drawing and describe why it is important to the habitat.
4. Draw an arrow to show a potential food source for a small mammal in your woodland scene.
5. Why would a woodland habitat be unsuitable for a creature adapted to live in a polar region?
