

Nova's Springtime Science Discovery

Learning objective: To observe and record the seasonal changes that happen during Spring, using scientific vocabulary to describe the natural world.

Go outside with an adult to find signs of Spring. Use this experiment-record sheet to draw and write about what you find. Look for new life, changes in the weather, and signs that the world is waking up after Winter. Remember to look closely at plants and trees just like Nova the Owl does!

Word bank: bud · blossom · green · sunny · sprout · warm · growth · flower

1. My First Discovery: What is one plant or tree that is starting to change? Describe what you see. (2 marks)

2. Weather Watch: What is the weather like today? Is it sunny, windy, or rainy? How does it feel? (2 marks)

3. Living Things: Did you see any insects or birds? Where were they and what were they doing? (2 marks)

4. Growth Tracking: Look at a flower or a bud. How has it changed since the Winter? (2 marks)

5. Scientific Conclusion: Why do you think Spring is a busy time for the natural world? (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Choose your favorite Spring flower and draw a detailed picture of it. Label the parts you can see, such as the stem, the petals, and the leaves.
