

Rosa's Spanish Wardrobe Challenge

Learning objective: To learn and apply vocabulary for items of clothing in Spanish, including gender agreement and simple descriptive phrases.

Read the clues carefully. Use the word bank to help you complete the sentences and translate the phrases into Spanish. Remember to check if the noun is masculine (el) or feminine (la).

Word bank: la camiseta (t-shirt) · los pantalones (pants) · el vestido (dress) · la chaqueta (jacket) · los zapatos (shoes) · el sombrero (hat) · rojo (red) · azul (blue) · verde (green) · amarillo (yellow)

1. Rosa is packing for a trip. Write the Spanish name for these three items: A t-shirt, pants, and a jacket. (3 marks)

2. If Rosa wants to say 'the red dress', how would she write it in Spanish? (Hint: The adjective usually comes after the noun). (2 marks)

3. Translate this sentence into English: 'El sombrero es amarillo.' (2 marks)

4. Choose two items from the word bank and write a full Spanish sentence describing their color. Example: Los zapatos son azules. (4 marks)

5. Why do we use 'los' instead of 'el' for 'pantalones'? Explain your reasoning. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Rosa the parrot wearing a bright green jacket (la chaqueta verde) and a blue hat (el sombrero azul). Label the items in Spanish.



Extension challenge: Research three more items of clothing in Spanish (such as socks, a skirt, or a coat) and write a short dialogue where you tell a friend what you are wearing today.
