

Rosa's Radiant Rainbow Garden

Learning objective: To identify and use Spanish vocabulary for colors to describe items in a creative garden scene.

Follow the drawing prompt to create your masterpiece. Then, use the Word Bank to label your drawing in Spanish. Finally, answer the challenge questions to demonstrate your mastery of the language.

Draw: Draw a vibrant garden scene featuring Rosa the parrot perched on a branch. In your scene, include: at least five different types of flowers, a buzzing bee, a butterfly, and a bright sun. Use a variety of colors from the word bank to fill in these items. Ensure your drawing is detailed, using patterns like stripes or spots on the petals to show off your artistic flair.



Label words: rojo (red) · naranja (orange) · amarillo (yellow) · verde (green) · azul (blue) · morado (purple) · rosa (pink) · blanco (white) · negro (black)

Steps:

1. Label three different flowers in your drawing using the correct Spanish color adjective. Ensure the adjective agrees with the noun (e.g., flor roja).
2. Explain why it is important to match the gender of the color adjective to the noun in Spanish. Use an example from your drawing.

3. If you were to paint a night-time scene, which colors from the word bank would you use most? Justify your choice.
4. Compare and contrast the colors found in a garden during spring versus fall. Which Spanish adjectives would you use for each season?
5. What might happen if you mixed the 'azul' paint with the 'amarillo' paint? Write the resulting color in Spanish.
6. Translate the following sentence: 'The butterfly is pink and black.'
